“The windowless structure houses up to 750 staff and will bring together for the first time the chief of joint operations; maritime, land, air and special operations staff; the joint operations intelligence centre; the special operations commander Australia and other Defence command elements. The Australian Federal Police will have representation, as will AusAid.

The site is surrounded by two perimeter fences capable of stopping a truck bomb.

A key feature of the command centre is the “knowledge wall” an 18m-long screen, made up of 60 individual televisions, that will allow commanders to watch live vision from units in the field.”
